

2026 FIFA World Cup One Sheet

This is the 23rd tournament and will take place from **June 11 - July 19 (39 days)** in North America.

It will be hosted by 16 cities across 3 countries – United States, Canada, and Mexico. Venues are below.

Los Angeles, Toronto, and Mexico City to host respective national teams' opening matches on June 12.

Officials just announced on Tuesday that fans can start applying for tickets starting on September 10.

Los Angeles will host 8 matches, all at SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, including:

- The highly coveted opening game for the U.S. Men's National Team on June 12.
- Two "Round of 32" knockout matches.
- Four group stage matches.
- A quarterfinal match.

There will be 48 teams, an increase of 16 from the previous 7 tournaments.

The total number of games played will increase from 64 to 104.

The previous World Cup was held in Qatar in 2022. Argentina took home the win for the third time.
